

Warren RECC's bill explained



Meter information

Gives dates of service and number of days of service, as well as the energy (kilowatt-hours) used during the billing period (1 kilowatt-hour = 1,000 watts). This is the energy (kWh) which you use that Warren RECC purchases from TVA.

TVA Fuel Cost

Formerly labeled as the "TVA Power Cost Adjustment," this per kilowatt-hour charge is determined on a monthly basis by our power provider, the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). The fuel cost is not based on the price of fuel like gasoline purchased at your local filling station. The monthly fuel cost is driven by the cost TVA pays for coal, natural gas, etc., needed to produce electricity and to purchase power.

Distribution Charge

The Distribution Charge is a fixed monthly charge to recover costs associated with providing electricity to our members. It includes facilities such as meters, poles, transformers, wire, and customer-related operating costs. **This is not a new charge; it was previously included on the monthly bill with energy charges.**

School Tax

Previously labeled as "Utility Tax." Kentucky school districts levy a 3 percent gross receipts tax (also called "school tax") on all utility services within the state. Warren RECC collects the tax from its members and submits it to the State of Kentucky for distribution to local school districts.

Message Center

The message center will be used to communicate current information to our members.

Seasonal Rates (effective April 1, 2011)

A TVA seasonal rate structure became effective with bills mailed after April 1, 2011. Seasonal rates have different prices during different seasons of the year. The rate will be highest during summer months when electricity usage nears TVA's full capacity to generate electricity and it costs more to generate power.

- Highest rates in summer months (June—September)
- Slightly lower rates in winter months (December—March)
- Lowest in other months (October, November, April, and May)
