## VACCINATIONS

#### MASKS

Last week, the CDC <u>announced</u> that fully vaccinated people at least 14 days out from their last shot do not need to wear a mask in most situations. On May 14, Governor Beshear <u>announced</u> Kentucky will follow suit, noting masks must still be worn in K-12, day cares, hospitals, nursing homes, correctional facilities, and on public transportation. He also named June 11 as the date he will lift the mask mandate completely. Read more <u>here</u>.
