BENEFITS

On Friday Aug. 21, Governor Beshear announced that the state's application to bring in additional federal money to aid unemployed Kentuckians has been approved. The program will allow about 80,000 Kentuckians who received benefits between July 26 and August 15 to receive an additional payment of \$400 for each of those weeks. Recipients can expect the payments sometime in early September.

VOTING

On Aug. 14, Governor Beshear and Secretary of State Michael Adams released their plan for voting in the general election.
