EXEC ORDERS


Governor Andy Beshear has recently renewed several important state Executive Orders:

- The statewide mask mandate was renewed for 30 more days.
- The ability to renew drivers licenses remotely is now in effect through July 31, 2021.
- The order allowing pharmacists to dispense 30 day supplies of prescriptions has been extended for another 30 days.
