Local Students Represent Warren RECC on Washington Youth Tour in D.C.

When you hear that Warren RECC invests in the communities we serve, it's not just in electrical infrastructure, economic development or the local events we support. Our commitment to community is all about you our members, and we're especially proud of the young people we sponsored on the 2018 Washington Youth Tour.

In June, five local high school seniors from the Warren RECC service area joined 85 other Kentucky electric co-op students for the weeklong program where they learned about the political process, interacted with elected officials and gained an up-close understanding of American history.

Our students joined more than 1,800 of rural America's best and brightest high-schoolers representing electric cooperatives across the country. Now in its 53rd year, the youth tour is designed to educate our youth about issues fac-

ing co-ops in hopes that they develop the passion for and commitment to protecting the cooperative model. We look forward to seeing these same faces leading our co-ops well into the future.

The trip takes place over eight days in June with a busy itinerary. This year, the delegation visited national

While we are more than excited to see the growth in our region, it does mean Warren RECC will need to make a few investments in our system to accommodate that growth. Over the next 24 months, Warren RECC will construct two new substations and a new fiber-backbone system to improve substation communications. As a way to help make broadband more accessible to rural areas, Warren RECC will offer spare fibers on this backbone system for lease to participating internet providers who are interested in offering service to our

area. Finally, this year, we will begin construction on new updated facilities for the Leitchfield and Morgantown offices.

We may be growing, but we're still your locally owned and operated electric cooperative. We are thankful for the many blessings of the last 80 years, and we consider it a pleasure to serve you, our member. We look forward to continued growth and good fortune well into the future and we can't wait to share it all with you.

In a rare opportunity, U.S. Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao visited privately with Kentucky's students at her offices.

Warren RECC employees Penney Baseheart and Tami Cohron joined Mary Beth Dennis from KAEC and 13 other co-op employees from around the state as chaperones for the Kentucky delegation. KAEC has been coordinating the tour for Kentucky co-ops since 1972, when 18 students and four chaperones made the trip.

In addition to Morrow, Drew, and Ray, Warren RECC sponsored Faith Morris of Butler County High School and Chaze Vinci of Franklin-Simpson High School on the youth tour.

"We are so proud of our Warren RECC students. This trip is more than just an educational experience. This trip is an investment in our co-op youth and the future of the co-ops themselves," says W.
