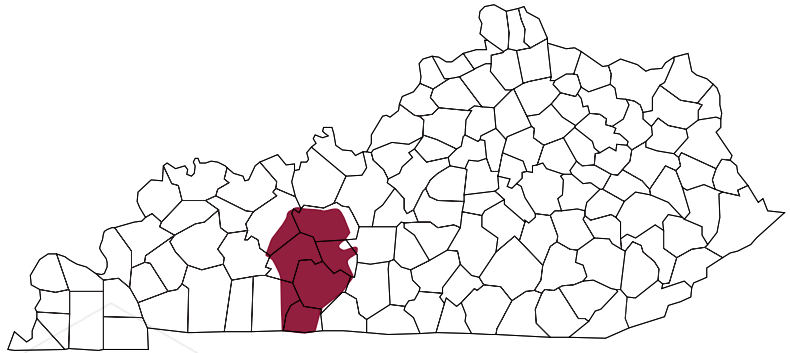

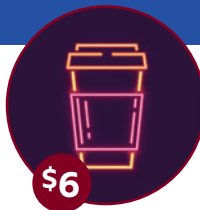

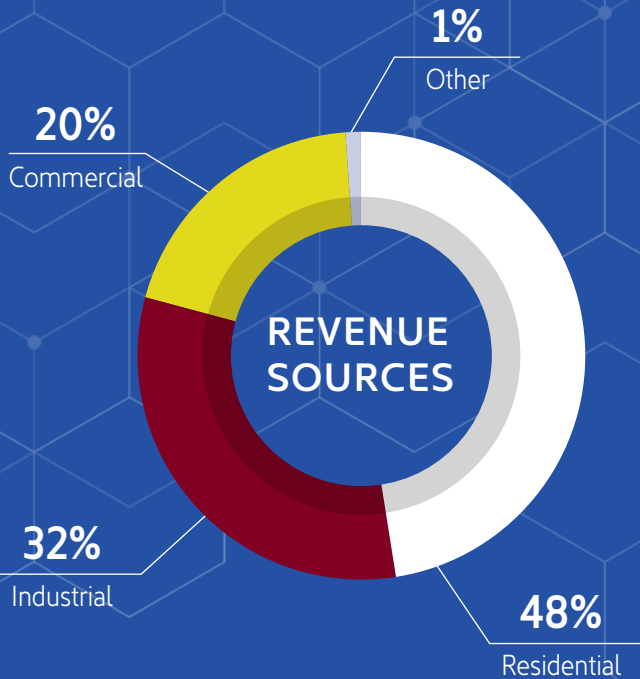


All-Day Power

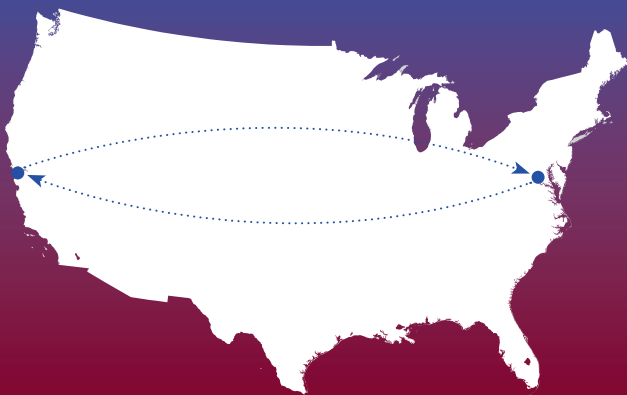
